Identification of Indian (Common) Mynas

- Sturdy cocoa-brown body, black head and throat
- White wing patch, obvious in flight
- Yellow bill, legs and around eye
- 23-25 cm
- Often forages on ground, walks with exaggerated swagger
- Do not confuse with native Noisy Miner (“squeakers”) (Mostly grey with no white in wing)
